so the biblical image of the Tree of Life has been chosen for the new community to echo this picture and express the same shared calling.

The Community has three aims:

Learning to live a life which is rooted, flourishing and fruitful

(Spiritual formation through monastic practices)

Inspiring a rising generation to pray

(Modelling a balance of contemplation and action)


Working with the Bishops of the Diocese to discern the activity of God across the county

(Listening, intercession and Kingdom announcement)



Purpose

Christians aged 20-35 are invited to spend a year together living in community, sharing in a daily rhythm of prayer, service, study, celebration and mission.



We are providing a unique opportunity for deepening discipleship through a formative year of living the spiritual disciplines together in Community. We pray that this transformative experience will equip our novices to be sent into the world to bring transformation to others.

The Community House stands on the site that 500 years ago was home to the Franciscan Grey Friars. They are remembered for burying Richard III, but they also had a ministry of prayer for the city and service to the poor. We pray that our new monastic community will build on this rich spiritual inheritance and become a house of prayer and hospitality for the whole Diocese.

Life Together

The Community will live in a newly purchased Georgian building situated in Cathedral Gardens. There will be a resident leadership team and up to 16 members.

Each week the Community members will be involved in social action projects in the city and will be sent out into the Diocese to work with partner churches in mission. The Community will be linked with the Cathedral and Launde Abbey.

Our novices will take prayer onto the streets of Leicester. They will work with schools and youth groups to inspire a rising generation to pray; exploring creative and engaging prayer practices. They will develop a pattern of intercession for the Diocese and invite young adults to join them in intercession nights in the basement prayer room of the Community House.

Each year we will seek to build a Community with a rich diversity of cultures, backgrounds and church traditions. Our novices will experience the challenge of living together under a set of Promises to a shared Way of Life and the opportunity to learn with people who may be very different to themselves.

Who is it for?

Single, committed Christians aged 20-35 who are hungry to learn and grow as disciples of Jesus. More information about the application process can be found on our website www.leicestertreeoflife.org
